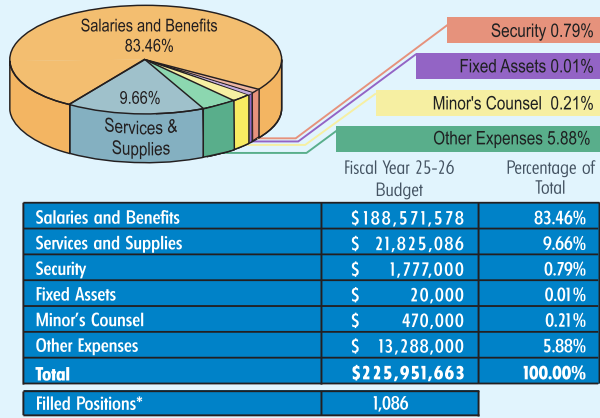


BUDGET

The goal of the Superior Court of California, County of San Diego, is to provide the highest level of service within budgeted appropriations.



Salaries and Benefits – Salaries and benefits of all court employees, except for judges, whose salaries are paid directly by the state.

Services and Supplies – Costs of office furniture, supplies, telecommunications and contractual services such as information technology and printing services.

Security – In FY 11-12, as a result of Trial Court Security Realignment (AB 118), sheriff-related security costs for courtroom security and perimeter security were transferred to the County of San Diego. The remaining security costs in the court budget include such areas as after-hours security for facilities and security equipment maintenance.

Fixed Assets – Purchase of equipment costing more than \$5,000 (e.g., furniture, copy machines).

Minor's Counsel – The costs to appoint private counsel to represent the interests of the child in a custody or visitation proceeding.

Other Expenses – Includes payments of County services (e.g., custodial costs), collection costs and traffic school monitoring costs.

FILINGS

Hundreds of thousands of Superior Court cases are handled each year in San Diego County. From July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025 (Fiscal Year 2024/2025), filings for all case types totaled nearly 319,000.

Welcome

The San Diego Superior Court is dedicated to delivering the highest standard of justice in every division. Over the past few years, we have made meaningful progress toward modernization, and we will continue that work to support more efficient, transparent, and user-friendly court operations.

My goals for the Court include strengthening communication with the public and our justice partners, leveraging technology, and enhancing data accuracy. By aligning our people and processes, we are enabling court users to engage with us online rather than in line whenever that is the preferred way to access services.

In 2026, we look forward to launching a new criminal case management system. This will bring all case types onto a single platform and improve access as criminal cases complete the transition from paper files to digital records.

We are also expanding online services. In early 2026, the Court will begin offering online exhibit submission in Family cases. Family joins Small Claims and Unlawful Detainer as case types where parties can submit exhibits electronically.

As we expand access and modernize services, I also want to offer a word of caution about increasingly sophisticated scams involving supposed court cases or jury duty. Be alert to red flags in any correspondence you receive and rely only on official court records. You can search for cases by name or case number using the online Court Index, and legitimate court documents will always include a case number. The Court conducts official correspondence through U.S. mail or, in some instances, by E-Service for parties who have opted in to receive notices electronically. The Court will not call or send text messages to resolve a court issue or collect a fine. The Court also will never require payment in cash. Payments may be made in person at courthouse business offices by cash, credit card, or check. Checks or credit card authorizations may be mailed to the appropriate courthouse, and in some matters, payments may be made online.

Inside this brochure, you will find a full list of self-help services; details on the types of cases that may be filed at each of our seven courthouse locations; a summary of case-filing activity; and an overview of the Court's budget.

JURY SERVICE INFORMATION

When you receive a summons to serve as a juror in the Superior Court, you are being asked to play a crucial role in the administration of justice. Some of the services provided by the court to ensure a smooth juror experience include:

Online Juror Portal

The court’s online Juror Portal allows summoned jurors to complete their Juror Affidavit ahead of arrival to the courthouse for jury service. Jurors can also make an online request for an excuse or disqualification from service, request a postponement, or request or transfer service to a more convenient location.

Automated Phone Line

The court also maintains a telephone line at (619) 844-2800 for recorded information and automated prompts available 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Jury services staff can answer phone inquiries on Monday through Thursday from 10:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., and on Fridays from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. For more information on Jury Services, please visit sdcourt.ca.gov/Jury.

One Day/One Trial

Under California law, once a juror has appeared in person at the courthouse for jury service or has served through Telephone Standby, the juror does not have to serve again for a period of 12 months.

Wireless Internet Access

Free Wireless Internet Service is provided for jurors serving at each court location.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Community outreach and education are essential to the San Diego Superior Court. By establishing and maintaining strong ties to the community and promoting knowledge about how our system of justice works, the court is better able to fulfill its mission of administering justice in a way that is both accessible and understandable to the public.

Student Outreach and Education

Students in San Diego County have many unique opportunities to learn about the California justice system firsthand through activities that take place right in the courthouse. Between courthouse tours, the Judges in the Classroom program, and other presentations geared toward specific grades, the San Diego Superior Court welcomes more than 10,000 student visitors each year. Volunteers

- Make online requests for Family Law case documents to be sent by mail.
- View court calendars by department.
- Look up information on court cases using our Court Index case search, Registers of Actions, or New Case Filings.
- Purchase select court documents online through the Register of Actions.
- Find quick links to Child Support, DMV, Sheriff’s Warrant, and Restraining Order indices.
- Find court locations and contact information.

If you do not have access to a computer in your home, most local libraries and the San Diego County Public Law Library (sandiegolawlibrary.org) provide computers with internet access for use by the public.
