Al-Anon Family Groups does background checks on adult, Al-Anon members who want to volunteer to sponsor Alateen meetings. Requirements are two years of continuous membership at Al-Anon meetings, passing the background check, and once a year Al-Anon Member In Alateen Service (AMIAS) Training/renewal of certification. This is a voluntary service position. For AMIAS'es at Institutions, sponsors also complete the GRF/San Diego County background check/pass it, and take the safety training at the GRF facility.
