Definitely an update from the logbooks and all of the Officers present were very proficient with the computer system and log in procedures for Juveniles.

All locks have been removed from the rooms in the building and there are no secure rooms at the substation. Rooms and area were very well maintained for an older facility. No issues with broken pieces etc. and interview area was clean and safe.

94 Total Non Secure custodies under 6 hours. Average stay is 2 hours or less.
