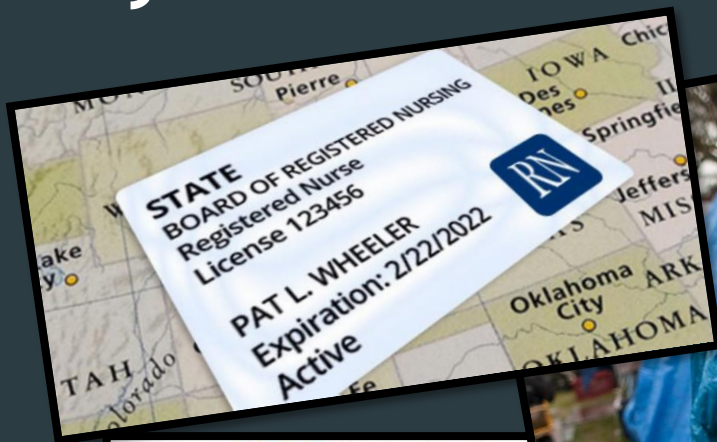

# Expungement (Dismissal) of Criminal Convictions

- ❑ What does it do?
- ❑ What convictions can be dismissed?
  - ❑ Infractions
  - ❑ Almost all misdemeanors (some sex offenses excluded)
  - ❑ Most felony convictions
    - ❑ Some sex offenses excluded
    - ❑ Felonies w/ probation or local prison sentences
    - ❑ If served state prison sentence for the case . . . . talk to a lawyer!
- ❑ Ineligible:
  - ❑ Owe any restitution (unless extraordinary circumstances)
  - ❑ On probation, mandatory supervision, PRCS, or parole
  - ❑ Pending charges or warrant out on any case
- ❑ Changes on the horizon????

# Expungement (Dismissal) of Criminal Conviction

- ▶ How much does it cost?
  - ▶ SD: \$60 per misdemeanor case; \$100 per felony case
  - ▶ BUT - most people qualify to waive these filing fees
- ▶ How long does it take to get a dismissal?

## Prop 47

- Reclassifying Certain Low Level Felonies to Misdemeanors
- Filing Deadline:  
**NOVEMBER 4, 2022**

## Prop 64

- Reclassifying Certain Marijuana Crimes to Misdemeanors, Infractions, or Non-crimes
- No filing deadline
- “Automatic” Legislation

# SB 384 - Tiered Sex Offender Registration

Transitioned from life-long registration to three tiers

- ▶ Tier One: 10 yrs. adults  
5 yrs. juveniles
- ▶ Tier Two: 20 yrs. adults  
10 yrs. juveniles
- ▶ Tier Three: Lifetime adults  
Does not apply to juveniles

Can someone stop registering if they believe they have met the minimum registration period?

**NO!!**

- ▶ Registrant must petition to be terminated from the registry AND must be granted relief by a judge before they can stop registering.
- ▶ Law is very specific on legal process needed to terminate an individual from the California Sex Registry.
- ▶ Contact Public Defender Fresh Program or a local attorney.

## California Department of Justice

### What is the Impact of Tiered Sex Offender Registration on California Criminal Justice Agencies?

The transition to tiered sex offender registration in California will have a significant impact on criminal justice agencies. Large portions of the petitioning process have been mandated under the law as the responsibility of the registering agencies, District Attorney's Offices, and the courts. The following information will provide an overview of how your organization will be affected. We highly encourage your organization to have resources and an implementation plan prepared for this significant change to sex offender registration in California.

CA DOJ will be assigning the statutorily designated tiers for sex offender registrants and will be processing the petition outcomes as necessary

#### REGISTERING AGENCIES

- Beginning January 1, 2021, LEAs will provide tier notification letter to registrant upon request.
- Beginning July 1, 2021, LEAs must provide registrant proof of current registration.
- Petitions for relief from registration shall be served on the LEA where the petition is filed and on the LEA in the county of conviction.
- Within 60 days of receipt of the petition, the LEA shall report to the DA and court on whether the requirements for relief from registration have been met.
  - LEAs will enter receipt of petition into the California Sex and Arson Registry.
  - LEAs are required to determine petitioner's eligibility for relief from registration.
- If an offense which may require registration is identified by the LEA, which has not been previously assessed by CA DOJ, the LEA shall refer that conviction to the CA DOJ.
- The LEA shall report to the court and DA when an extension of time has been requested by CA DOJ to determine a tier designation based on a newly discovered offense.

#### SUPERIOR AND JUVENILE COURTS

- Beginning on July 1, 2021, courts will be accepting petitions from sex offender registrants.
- Beginning on July 1, 2021, courts will grant, deny, or dismiss petitions for relief from registration as a sex offender.
  - Courts shall set the time periods for filing new petitions for relief from registration (minimum of one year and a maximum of five years).
- Courts must notify the CA DOJ of the outcome of petitions for relief from registration and the time period for filing a new petition.

#### DISTRICT ATTORNEYS

- Petitions for relief from registration shall be served on the DA in the county where the petition is filed and in the county of conviction.
- The DA in the county of registration may request a hearing within 60 days if the petitioner has not met the requirements under PC 290(e) or if community safety would be significantly enhanced by continued registration.
- DAs will be working with their registering agencies to coordinate overall petition process.

### Frequently Asked Questions

#### California Tiered Sex Offender Registration (Senate Bill 384)

##### For Registrants

The California Department of Justice (CA DOJ) Sex Offender Registry has developed the following frequently asked questions in reference to Senate Bill (SB) 384. The information provided below is general information and is not intended as legal advice.

NOTE: The CA DOJ cannot provide legal advice.

What is SB 384?

Effective January 1, 2021, SB 384 transitioned California's lifetime sex offender registration schema to a tier-based schema. SB 384 established three tiers of registration for adult registrants for periods of 10 years, 20 years, and life, and two tiers of registration for juvenile registrants for periods of 5 years and 10 years. SB 384 allows the registrant to petition the superior court or juvenile court for termination of their sex offender registration requirement on or after their next birthday after July 1, 2021, following the expiration of their mandated minimum registration period. Based on criteria listed in SB 384, the court will either grant or deny the petition.

#### IMPORTANT DATES

Beginning on January 1, 2021, the CA DOJ designates tiers for registrants.

Beginning on July 1, 2021, on or after their next birthday after July 1, 2021, registrants who meet the mandated minimum requirements may petition for termination of their sex offender registration requirement in the superior court or juvenile court in the county in which they reside.

Beginning on January 1, 2022, registrants will be displayed on the Megan's Law website pursuant to Penal Code section 290.46 as amended under SB 384.

When did SB 384 take effect?

The tier-based sex offender registration schema took effect on January 1, 2021.

Pursuant to Penal Code section 290.5(a)(1) as amended under SB 118 and SB 384, tier one, tier two, and "Tier Three – Risk Assessment Level" registrants may file a petition in the superior court or juvenile court in their county of residence for termination of their California sex offender registration requirement. Registrants may petition the court following the expiration of their mandated minimum registration period on or after their next

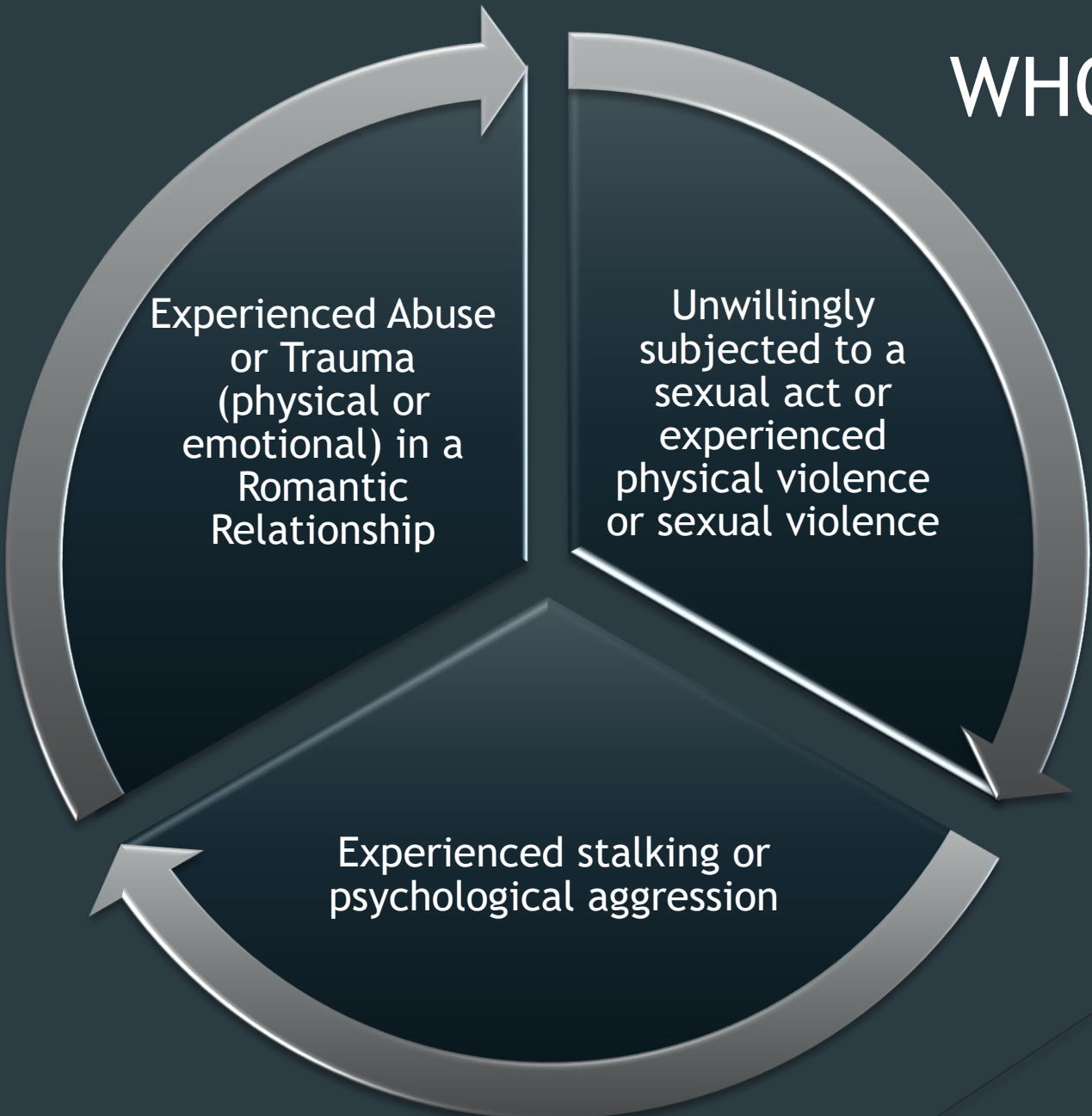

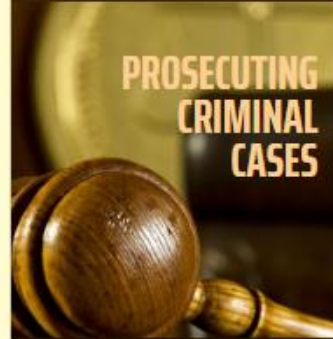

# Conviction Review Requests

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## The George "Woody" Clarke Conviction and Sentence Review Unit (CASRU)

The San Diego County District Attorney's Office is committed to ensuring the integrity of convictions and recommending re-sentencing when it is in the interest of justice. Our Conviction and Sentencing Review Unit (CASRU) examines post-conviction claims of innocence where credible and verifiable evidence of innocence exists, or new technologies exist to test or retest remaining evidence. CASRU also takes a second look at sentences to determine whether a sentence currently being served should be reduced. To that end, we follow the highest standard of professional integrity and work collaboratively with our justice partners and innocence advocates. We are also partnering with community service providers to help ensure inmates who re-enter the community are provided the services and support needed for success.

### CONVICTION REVIEW

CASRU accepts all applications capable of investigation and review, which, if substantiated, would result in a finding of a wrongful conviction. CASRU will review convictions which were obtained in a jury trial, bench (non-jury) trial, or part of a knowing and voluntary guilty plea. We also consider cases involving any felony, not just serious or violent felonies.

CASRU investigations are not limited to the issues raised by the application. We will consider all relevant issues uncovered during an investigation even if such issues were not raised during the initial prosecution or in a later appellate review.

If after consideration of the evidence originally known at the time of conviction and all additional information learned after conviction review, the District Attorney no longer has confidence in the integrity of a conviction, the District Attorney will take whatever action is reasonably necessary to achieve justice, including, but not limited to, exoneration.

### Requirements

Individuals making a claim of innocence must meet the following criteria:

- The conviction must have occurred in San Diego County Superior Court;
- The conviction may be for any felony;
- The application must be based on credible and verifiable evidence of innocence;
- Applicant must agree to fully cooperate with the District Attorney's Office, which includes providing disclosure of all information relevant to the case.

**APPLICATION FOR CONVICTION REVIEW**

The Conviction Review Unit of the San Diego County District Attorney's Office investigates claims of *actual* innocence exclusively and retains complete discretion to deny an application for conviction review. **The Conviction Review Unit will not consider requests for resentencing.**

**Requirements:** In order to qualify for a conviction review by the San Diego District Attorney's Office, the case and applicant must meet the following criteria:

- a. The conviction must have occurred in San Diego County Superior Court;
- b. Applicant must be in custody, serving time on the sentence for which he/she was wrongfully convicted;
- c. The conviction must be for a violent and/or serious felony as defined by Penal Code sections 667.5 (c) and 1192.7 (c) (1)-(42) (e.g. murder, rape, robbery, etc.).
- d. The application for review must be based on credible and verifiable evidence of innocence; and
- e. Applicant agrees to fully cooperate with the District Attorney's Office, which includes providing disclosure of all relevant information during the review process.

# Resentencing Requests

## SENTENCING REVIEW

California Penal Code section 1170(d)(1) was amended by the California Legislature in 2019, giving District Attorneys the authority to recommend that a court recall and resentence criminal defendants. If the court agrees, he/she will resentence an inmate to a term less than and no greater than the initial sentence. The law recognizes that an inmate may have served sufficient time, have been adequately rehabilitated and, therefore, will be ready for a safe and law-abiding reentry. In those cases, the District Attorney will recommend a recall and resentencing in the interests of justice. Requirements

Individuals interested in sentencing review must meet the following criteria:

- a. The conviction must have occurred in San Diego County Superior Court;
- b. The Applicant was convicted of a felony;
- c. The Applicant is currently incarcerated;
- d. The Applicant was not convicted of a special circumstance (Penal Code § 190.2) and sentenced to life without the possibility of parole. Special circumstances cannot not be dismissed by law;

If an Applicant meets the above criteria, they must fill out the application questionnaire and the three waiver forms below.

### Application Information

The San Diego County District Attorney's Office welcomes applications for sentencing review and is committed to reviewing these requests in a fairly and promptly. Because the decision to recommend resentencing is discretionary, applicants are encouraged to provide as much accurate information as possible. If an applicant for sentencing review claims their conviction was deficient due to new evidence of actual innocence or wrongful conviction, the applicant must instead file a Conviction Review application.


