**Currently in all four drug courts, we have 277 participants. **

- Most common substance of choice is methamphetamine, followed by heroin.
- 35% of drug court admissions identify as having co-occurring mental health illness at entry.
- Convictions include drug, property, DUI and domestic violence.

**Currently in VTC, we have 29 participants. **

- Convictions break-down:
 - o 13 DUI (45%)
 - o 7 domestic violence related (24%)
 - 3 property crimes (10%)
 - o 7 other (assault, drug possession) (24%)
- 28 out of 29 participants were assessed as having a mental health need
 - 17 were diagnosed with PTSD (59%)
 - o 6 were diagnosed with a mood disorder (21%)
 - 1 person has diagnosed Traumatic Brain Injury
 - o 21 identify alcohol as a problematic substance
- Since July 2015, 52 h-motions were granted.

**Currently in RCP, we have 22 participants. **

- Convictions break-down:
 - 20 drug/property related (91%)
 - o 2 other, including assault, DUI and DV (9%)
- 100% of participants were assessed with a substance use disorder
 - 15 are poly-substance users (68%)
 - 18 identify meth as a problem (82%)
 - 4 identify heroin/opiates as a problem (18%)
- Many participants uncover underlying mental health needs after a period of sobriety. Generally, we see anxiety, mood and psychotic disorders in the clients we accept.
